#### 4.3 Instruction to the teachers

#### 4.3.1 Work Culture

- ❖ The work culture of the school has to be created, valued and respected. A teacher should participate whole-heartedly in all school activities and work in coordination.
- Teachers should accept work assigned gracefully and accept challenges in new fields.
- ❖ Teachers should be ready to lend a helping hand to their colleagues in school and guide visitors in the school premises. Courteous and cooperative behavior with colleagues is important.
- ❖ Schedule for submitting records, etc. must be strictly adhered to.
- ❖ Teachers to monitor supervise and identify each student according to individual differences based on SWOT analysis: strength, weakness, opportunity and threat.
- ❖ The social climate of mutual confidence should prevail in the classroom to encourage students to confide in their teacher. Social graces and courtesies should be instilled in the class.
- Students should not be sent on any personal errands during the lessons. In fact no official document should be handled by the student.
- ❖ A student should be dealt with understanding/love in a courteous manner with firmness as per the situation.
- ❖ Teacher should experiment, innovate and enrich their knowledge and apply the same in classrooms.

#### 4.4 Instruction to the class teachers

- ❖ Give the most conducive environment to your students and be their biggest cheerleader.
- Set classroom norms with the help of the students and encourage them to adhere to the same at all times.
- ❖ Be open and willing to learn at all times. Strive to improve your teaching each and every day, even when you've been in the classroom for years.
- ❖ Ensure 100 % participation of students in Integrated Introductory Activity. The activity should be prepared one month in advance.
- Class teacher must try to help each child in achieving the maximum learning outcomes in her class, however, the minimum learning outcomes must be achieved by each student in all respect.
- All lesson plans must be based on joyful learning to enhance skills and all-round development of the child.
- Class teachers and subject teachers must meet once a month to identify learning gaps and prepare remedial plan for the same.
- Weekly department meeting and monthly staff meeting must be attended by all.

- ❖ Based on the result analysis, low achievers to be identified and arrangements for remedial classes must be done.
- Peer tutor and group teaching must be encouraged for the identified students. Detail schedule for the same to be prepared by the class-coordinators.
- Any lapses in the delivery of the content must be brought to the notice of the class-coordinator/coordinator.
- Always be fair and consistent as your students are looking up to you as their role model.

#### 4.4.1 Punctuality and Attendance

- ❖ A teacher is expected to arrive at least five minutes prior to the first bell. No staff member shall leave the school premises during school hours without permission of the Principal. On arrival/dispersal at the school, teachers must ensure their Biometric attendance.
- \* Teacher must ensure that they observe strict punctuality in going to their classes.
- ❖ If any teacher is granted leave of absence, assignments for the class must be submitted. If a teacher cannot attend the school, leave application must be submitted immediately. If this is not possible, the school must be informed telephonically before 8 a.m. on that day, and leave application must be submitted the following day. Leave will not be granted unless these rules are complied with.
- Teachers should take care of their health and avoid absenteeism.

#### 4.4.2 Parent Teacher Meeting and Follow-up

❖ Teachers are expected to deal with parents courteously. Parent-teacher meetings are held throughout 22 the year for discussing the progress and difficulties/problems of the student. No teacher is permitted to meet the parent during regular study hours as it disturbs the teacher's work schedule. However, if the parents wish to meet the teachers they can meet them on Saturdays (Except 2nd Saturday) between 9.30 a.m. to 10.30 a.m. with prior appointment. Teacher to document parent interaction and regularly conduct the follow up.

#### 4.4.3 School Almanac

❖ Each student is issued a diary in which the timetable/daily homework is recorded. All communications to the parent should be indicated in the Almanac. Class teacher must ensure that each student should follow the instructions stated in the Almanac. It is mandatory to bring the almanac to the school every day.

#### 4.4.4 Evaluation of Pupils' Work

❖ A full record of Assignments, Continuous evaluation and Term exam must be kept by each subject teacher and given to the class teacher in each Term. The students record file to be maintained by all the class teachers. All columns are to be filled & remarks to be endorsed.

#### 4.4.5 Maintenance of Records

- ❖ All teachers must ensure that an adequate amount of written work is assigned to students and the work is systematically and carefully corrected. Class work and home assignments must be written in proper columns in their notebooks.
- ❖ The respective subject teachers of a class must plan home assignments in consultation and coordination with each other to maintain proper balance in home assignments of the day or the week. Assignments must be planned to reinforce learning and hone the thinking skills.
- Stress should be laid on improving handwriting and spellings. The fundamentals of good handwriting have to be stressed repeatedly i.e. uniformity in slant, size and distancing of letters and words.
- ❖ The teacher must sign and endorse the date after correction of the written work. Students must be instructed to note their mistakes and do the corrections work before attempting new assignments.
- Attention of each student should be drawn towards
  - Proper indexing is the best way for systematic work and proper checking.
  - Neat work
  - Submission of written work on time
  - Follow up of teacher's note or correction work

#### 4.4.6 Assembly

- The sanctity and solemnity of the assembly should be maintained and preserved.
- Students should walk in a line accompanied by the class teacher to the assembly. The posture must be upright. Prayers/ Songs should be sung in unison.
- Students should be groomed and guided in public speaking during the assembly
